WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

After the Passion took place, St. Thomas had a hard time accepting the fact that life comes through death. He could not believe until he had seen the Risen Lord. And then he had to put his hand into His side and exclaim, "My Lord and my God." He recognized the Lord as the same Jesus he had known and loved before. It was by that power of love that St. Thomas was moved to believe. It almost seems as though Jesus was scolding St. Thomas for his lack of faith. But that was not so. There are many ways to come to faith and "doubting" may be the only way for some to find God.

Faith is a life-long process of exploration and discovery. Sometimes that journey is filled with all kinds of detours and ways that seem unsure and unsafe. When it comes to faith, no one of us has it all together. We are always searching and looking for ways and means to make our faith stronger and deeper.

The Scriptures today remind us that our journey of faith is filled at times with doubt and darkness, failure and fear, locked doors and closed minds. Sometimes life can be filled with sickness, dependencies and confusion. It almost seems that we have less faith when it comes to living through a difficult period of disappointment, sickness or the death of a loved one. However, it is exactly at those times of trial that our faith is strengthened and renewed. It is then that we realize that Jesus has the words of everlasting life. Like St. Peter, we have to say, "Lord, to whom else can we go?"

When we talk about faith, we should not make the mistake that we can sort things out by thinking up some good arguments or reasons to believe. We may be able to do part of it by reasoning, but faith is a gift from God. It also involves our trust, and that is a matter of the heart. It also includes our faithfulness in living out what we believe. Finally, it involves the promise of a new and hope-filled tomorrow. The kingdom of God is here and it is yet to come. All of this is a matter of faith.

The story of St. Thomas reminds us that faith without some struggle really isn't much faith after all. Even if our faith is as small as a mustard seed, we have a good start and with that faith we can move mountains.

We know that spring follows winter; April does give way to May, and then to summer. We also know that the darkness of night turns into the brightness of day. Our God will bring Resurrection, new hope and new life to all those who follow in the way of His Son. Our only response after all is said and done is to proclaim the good news to others by trusting in and living out what we believe.

Después de la Pasión, Santo Tomás tuvo un momento difícil para aceptar el hecho de que la vida viene a través de la muerte. No podía creer hasta que había visto al Señor Resucitado. Y luego tuvo que poner su mano en su costado y exclamar: "Mi Señor y mi Dios". Reconoció al Señor como el mismo Jesús que había conocido y amado antes. Fue por ese poder de amor que St. Thomas sintió la necesidad de creer. Casi parece como si Jesús regañara a Santo Tomás por su falta de fe. Pero eso no fue así. Hay muchas maneras de llegar a la fe y "dudar" puede ser la única forma para que algunas personas encuentren a su Dios.

La fe es un proceso de exploración y descubrimiento que dura toda la vida y, a veces, ese viaje está lleno de todo tipo de desvíos y formas que parecen inseguras e inseguras. Cuando se trata de la fe, ninguno de nosotros lo tiene todo junto. Siempre estamos buscando y buscando maneras y medios para hacer nuestra fe más fuerte y más profunda.

Las Escrituras de hoy nos recuerdan que nuestro camino de fe se llena a veces de duda y oscuridad, fracaso y temor, puertas cerradas y mentes cerradas. A veces la vida puede estar llena de enfermedades, dependencias y confusión. Casi parece que tenemos menos fe cuando se trata de vivir un período difícil de decepción, la enfermedad o la muerte de un ser querido. Sin embargo, es exactamente en esos momentos de prueba que nuestra fe se fortalece y se renueva. Es entonces cuando nos damos cuenta de que Jesús tiene las palabras de la vida eterna. Al igual que San Pedro, tenemos que decir: "Señor, ¿a quién más podemos ir?"

Cuando hablamos de fe no debemos cometer el error de que podemos resolver las cosas inventando algunos buenos argumentos o razones para creer. Podemos ser capaces de hacer parte de ella mediante el razonamiento, pero la fe es un regalo de Dios, que también implica nuestra confianza, y esa es una cuestión del corazón. También incluye nuestra fidelidad en vivir lo que creemos. Finalmente implica la promesa de un mañana nuevo y lleno de esperanza. El reino de Dios está aquí y está por venir. Todo esto es una cuestión de fe.

La historia de Santo Tomás nos recuerda que la fe sin alguna lucha realmente no es mucha fe después de todo. Incluso si nuestra fe es tan pequeña como un grano de mostaza, tenemos un buen comienzo y con esa fe podemos mover montañas.

Sabemos que la primavera sigue al invierno; Abril da paso a mayo y luego al verano. También sabemos que la oscuridad de la noche se convierte en el brillo del día. Nuestro Dios traerá Resurrección, nueva esperanza y vida nueva a todos aquellos que siguen el camino de Su Hijo. Nuestra única respuesta después de todo lo que se dice y hace es proclamar buenas nuevas a los demás al confiar y vivir lo que creemos.

QUESTION: What do we mean when we speak about God's "mercy"?

ANSWER: This weekend, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, in which we are reminded of Jesus' infinite mercy and love for us. This celebration was established with the help of St. John Paul II, who had come to develop a devotion to the "Divine Mercy" during his time in Krakow. In the 1930's a religious sister (now saint) Faustina Kowalska experienced a number of visions in which Jesus relayed to her the tremendous merciful love of God. Out of these experiences developed a series of devotions whereby we are encouraged to ask for God's mercy and then in turn show that mercy to others.

When people think about God, there are often caricatures that come to mind. Some people think of a brooding angry God, while others think of God as the ultimate "nice guy." These caricatures (which are both inaccurate) can force the false dichotomy of seeing God's justice as opposed to his mercy and his mercy as a setting aside of justice. However, in God there are no parts and so God's justice and mercy cannot be separated, as justice and mercy can be for us finite creatures. This means that anything that we say about God's mercy and justice will necessarily be limited, since God has a very different way of being than we do.

Bishop Robert Barron has often described God's justice, and even his anger as, "the desire to set things right." This definition means that we would not want a form of mercy that ignores justice because we would not want a God who does not have a passion for setting right the evils and sufferings of the world. With that in mind, perhaps it is best to think of God's mercy as the manner in which he brings about justice. Mercy means, not setting aside justice, but rather, setting aside revenge. God's mercy means that he seeks to set things right, including setting right the heart of the one who has sinned. We can also seek justice in the world (which may even include punishment), while simultaneously exercising mercy (which is the desire for the good even of the guilty).
