Called to Be Salt & Light

According to the Gospel, we are supposed to be the “salt of the earth” and “the light of the world.” We are salt of the earth when we are an active part of our community, serving in a sense to preserve what is good and lovely. We are the light of the world when we light up consciences, minds and hearts.

Isaiah points out the corporal works of mercy: feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, give drink to the thirsty, visit the imprisoned, visit the sick, bury the dead. These are the classical and tangible ways of being salt and light, things that we do personally or that we support through the parish, the poor box, Catholic charities, etc..

There are also the spiritual works of mercy, deeply important because they address needs deeper than the body—they help the soul.

Admonish the sinner: This is the correction that parents and friends give to those who are on the wrong track. Do we care enough about somebody to lead them to virtue, to be a spiritual guide or an example? Do we let our light shine to them? It’s a work of mercy to give a moral “wakeup call” for somebody about whom we care. *Instruct the ignorant:* It is surprising the lack of knowledge there is in our world about the Church and how much prejudice. Do we try to dispel that when we have the chance? When people speak about our Church and are misinformed, it is a work of mercy to give them the truth. *Counsel the doubtful:* Are we willing to let our own faith experience give strength to others whose faith is tested over and over? Sometimes when people are too emotionally involved to make a clear decision, we can see the way more clearly than they. It’s a work of mercy to let them see what we see. *Comfort the sorrowful:* People suffer pains in many ways, not only from death in a family but from illness, a job loss or from transition and different kinds of traumas. Are we willing to be strength to them when they are weak? *Bear wrongs patiently and Forgive all injuries:* People are quick to retaliate, to strike back. Do we realize that sometimes we must absorb some of the pain of the world and not simply spread it around? *Pray for the living and the dead:* We can lift up in prayer our leaders, our friends and people to whom we can’t speak. Everyone needs prayer.

People admire the Church when it engages in corporal works of mercy: hospitals, jail ministries, food kitchens, work with refugees or immigration and various kinds of outreach. But when the Church talks about opening our lives to the truth of Christ, the Church faces hostility. While there are many with physical needs, there are many more desperately in need of the spiritual works of mercy. It is not enough to say, “I’ll help the parish priest, Pope or others to be salt and light.” The Lord calls every one of His followers to be salt and light to our world, to light up consciences, minds and lives through the works of mercy, both corporal and spiritual.

Anointing of the Sick

Jesus sent his twelve apostles two by two to teach and heal in His name. After the resurrection of Jesus, an anointing with oil brought His healing to the sick. "Is anyone sick among you? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven." The pastoral practice of the Church today calls for anointing of the sick in case of serious illness—physical, emotional or mental, e.g., when sick with an illness such as pneumonia, preparing for surgery, seriously depressed or when weak from the burdens of old age. Through this sacrament the Church prays that the recipient may receive strength to deal with their illness or condition. It is no longer reserved for those whose death is imminent, but instead provides grace for spiritual comfort and healing. It can be received multiple times. It can be preceded by Penance and followed by Eucharist. It is available upon request to one of our priests, or may be requested in the hospital where a chaplain priest may administer the sacrament.

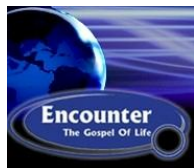
