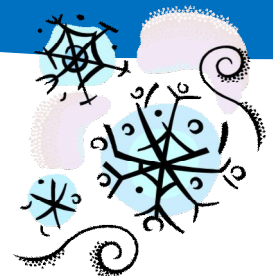

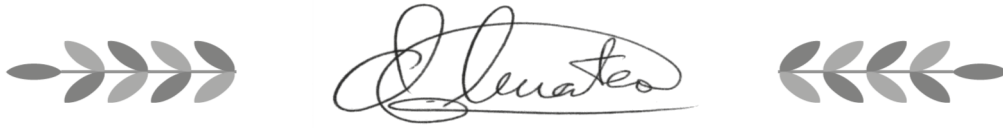

WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR



Advent is a time of waiting and watching, of longing and expectation. We long for the day when we will have our lives in order and are able to settle down and really enjoy all that life has to offer. It is no easy task to know who we are and what we are called to be.

During Advent we again meet John the Baptist. People from miles around flocked to hear what he had to say. John was not at a loss for words when he answered them: "No, I am not the Messiah. No, I am not Elijah, nor even the expected prophet. I am a voice crying out in the desert. Make straight the way of the Lord. There is one coming after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to unfasten." John had found his God and he knew what God expected of him. He realized his call and was restless until it was done. That is the secret of life, the way to happiness, the purpose and goal of our faith. We are to find our God. Listen to His call, know our mission in life and then do it. It demands the very best in each of us every day of our lives.

John was not the Messiah, but he was a strong voice crying out. He was not the light, but he was a witness to that light. He was not the center of it all, but he knew his place in the plan God had for the salvation of his people. Each of us in our own unique way has been called to the work of the kingdom. Each of us has special gifts and talents, and they have been given to help bring that kingdom to fruition. When we fail to use our time, talent and treasure, we only prolong and delay that day when the kingdom will become a reality.

John knew what he had to be about because he was a man of prayer. Paul reminds us that we are to never cease praying. We are not to stifle the Spirit given to us. We are to do good and avoid evil. It is our prayer that tells us who we are, and what we are to do. It is our prayer that gives us courage and strength to respond to the call that God has given to you and to me.

Isaiah once again reminds us. The Spirit of the Lord is upon us. We have also been anointed, set apart to bring glad tidings to the poor, healing to the broken hearted, freedom to those bound by doubt and despair, release to those imprisoned by alienation and rejection.

We are to announce a year of favor from the Lord to all those who have lost their way and no longer worship with us. We are to bring His peace to our troubled and violent world. We are to be people of hope, rejoicing in the Lord for He has called us to be his very own. You and I are a sign and promise of His love.

John no estaba en una pérdida para las palabras cuando se trataba de contestar: "No, no soy el Mesías. No, no soy Elías, ni siquiera el Profeta esperado. Yo soy una voz clamando en el desierto. Enderezad el camino del Señor. Hay uno que viene después de mí, que la correa de su sandalia yo no soy digno de desatar." John había encontrado a su Dios y él sabía lo que Dios espera de él. Se dio cuenta de su llamado y estaba inquieto hasta que se hizo. Ese es el secreto de la vida, el camino a la felicidad, el propósito y la meta de nuestra fe. Estamos para encontrar a nuestro Dios. Escuchar su llamado, saber a nuestra misión en la vida y entonces hacerlo. Exige lo mejor de cada uno de nosotros cada día de nuestras vidas.

Juan no era el Mesías, pero era una voz fuerte gritando. No era la luz, pero él era un testigo a la luz. Él no era el centro de todo, pero sabía que su lugar en el plan de Dios para la salvación de su pueblo. Cada uno de nosotros en nuestra propia manera única ha sido llamado a la obra del Reino. Cada uno de nosotros tiene dones especiales y talentos, y se les ha dado para ayudar a traer el Reino a la frucción. Cuando somos capaces de utilizar nuestro tiempo, talento y tesoro, sólo prolonga y retrasar ese día cuando el Reino se convertirá en una realidad.

John sabía lo que tenía que ser porque él era un hombre de oración. Pablo nos recuerda que nos encontramos para nunca dejar de orar. Estamos no para sofocar al espíritu dado a nosotros. Estamos para hacer el bien y evitar el mal. Es nuestra oración que nos dice quiénes somos y lo que somos. Es nuestra oración que nos da valor y fuerza para responder a la llamada que Dios le ha dado a usted y a mí.

Una vez más recordar a Isaías. El espíritu del Señor está sobre nosotros. Nos hemos también sido ungidos, conjunto aparte que traen alegres nuevas a los pobres, sanar a los quebrantados de corazón, libertad a las obligadas por las dudas y desesperación, liberan a los encarcelados por alienación y rechazo.

Usted y yo estamos para anunciar un año de gracia del Señor a todos aquellos que han perdido el camino y no adorar con nosotros. Estamos para traer su paz a nuestro mundo turbulento y violento. Somos personas de esperanza, regocijándose en el Señor porque él nos ha llamado a ser su propio. Tu y yo somos un signo y promesa de su amor.

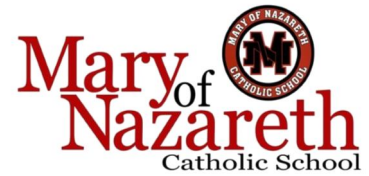

QUESTION: What are the "O Antiphons"?

ANSWER: Over the centuries, much thought and care has been put into the development of the Church's liturgical rituals, especially the Mass. Occasionally, we can find creative little nuggets hidden right before our eyes. One hidden piece of creativity is found in the "O Antiphons." In the week preceding Christmas, there is a hidden message found in the Antiphons that precede the reading of the Gospel. As we listen to the singing of the antiphons, each day we hear a new title for Jesus. The outline is as follows:

December 17 – O Wisdom – *O Sapientia*

December 18 – O Lord – *O Adonai*

December 19 – O Root of Jesse – *O Radix Jesse*

December 20 – O Key of David – *O Clavis David*

December 21 – O Dayspring – *O Oriens*

December 22 – O King of Nations – *O Rex Gentium*

December 23 – O God is with us – *O Emmanuel*



An astute observer will notice that these titles also make an appearance in the hymn: *O Come, O Come Emmanuel*. If we take the first letter of each of the titles in Latin, it forms the following: S-A-R-C-O-R-E. If we then reverse the letters, we get the following message: "*Ero Cras*," which translated from Latin to English means, "Tomorrow, I will be [there]." Thus, each day of the week we march forward to the full message and forward towards the object of our hope. As Christmas Eve approaches, we receive a little pre-Christmas present: the promise that tomorrow Christ will be with us!
