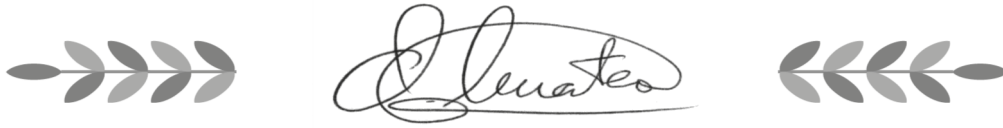

WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR



Isn't it true that our lives are filled with all kinds of surprises? They really open up our eyes to something new, wonderful, exciting. Sometimes surprises are frightening and we are afraid of what might happen next. There are other times when we are not sure what God is doing, what He expects of us or how we will ever get the job done, "For my ways are not your ways nor your ways my ways," says the Lord.

Throughout human history, God has acted in unexpected ways, at a most inopportune moment, in a place not well known, with a people who were not well liked nor appreciated. In a most astonishing way, He prepares a dwelling place for His Son. When Israel is under Roman domination, in a little town of Nazareth, Joseph of the house of David is betrothed to a young virgin whose name is Mary. And the angel told her, "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son and you shall name Him Jesus". She is deeply troubled and scared. She wonders how this marvelous event shall come about. "Do not be afraid Mary, you have found favor with God and don't forget, nothing is impossible with God." And Mary said yes. Let it be. Mary's fiat changed history.

By her "Yes", Mary made the gift of herself back to God, a sign of her trust, her faith in His promises. When most of us pray, we beg that Thy will be changed, not thy will be done. Maybe we don't say it in those words but we try to twist God's arm. We try to have things go our way because we need to be in control. It is not easy to let go, to let God be God, to trust Him when things don't go our way. We need a deeper faith in His love and a firmer hope in His promises. We need to be like Mary who was humble, obedient and poor - not poor in the sense of money or clothes or food - but poor in the sense of total dependence upon our God, acknowledging Him as Our Father. Only those who are in need and recognize that they are not able to satisfy that need are free to be without fear. They are the ones who can rejoice in the God of surprises.

Remember nothing is impossible with our God. The one who was faithful to His promise to Mary is also the same God who invites us to bear His Son into our fragile and broken lives. Through that same Spirit that overshadowed Mary, we can make Christ flesh again in our troubled world, during these difficult and frightening days.

What happened 2,000 years ago happens again today. Like Mary, we say our yes. Let it be. That is a matter of trust and a measure of our faith.

¿No es cierto que nuestras vidas están llenas de todo tipo de sorpresas? Estas sorpresas nos abren los ojos ante algo nuevo, maravilloso y emocionante. También a veces, estas sorpresas son aterradoras y tememos a lo que sucederá a continuación. En otras veces, no estamos seguros lo que Dios está haciendo, de lo que El espera de nosotros o de cómo llevaremos a cabo lo que nos esta pidiendo, "porque mis caminos no son vuestros caminos ni vuestros caminos mis caminos", dice el Señor.

A lo largo de la historia humana, Dios ha estado actuando de modos inesperados, en los momentos más inoportunos, en un lugar no conocido y con un pueblo que que no era del agrado de nadie, Israel, ni tampoco apreciado. De la manera más sorprendente, prepara una morada para su Hijo. Cuando Israel está bajo dominación romana, en un pequeño pueblo de Nazaret, José de la casa de David se compromete con una joven virgen cuyo nombre es María. Y el ángel le dijo. "He aquí, concebirás en tu seno y dará a luz a un hijo y le pondrás por nombre Jesús". Ella está profundamente preocupada y asustada. Ella solo pregunta cómo este maravilloso evento sucederá. "No tengas miedo María, porque has encontrado favor con Dios y no te olvides, nada es imposible con Dios." Y María dijo que sí. Que sea lo que Dios quiera. María así cambió el curso de la historia.

Por su "Sí", María se hizo regalo para Dios, una señal de su confianza y de su fe en sus promesas. Cuando oramos, en realidad suplicamos a Dios mío que se haga su voluntad sino que se cumpla la nuestra. Tal vez no lo decimos con esas palabras pero tratamos de torcer el brazo de Dios. Tratamos de hacer que las cosas sucedan como nosotros queremos porque tenemos que estar en control. No es fácil dejar que Dios sea Dios, y confiar en él cuando las cosas no van a nuestra manera. Necesitamos una fe más profunda en su amor y una esperanza más firme en sus promesas. Tenemos que ser como María, que era humilde, obediente y pobre, no pobre en el sentido de dinero, ropa o comida pero pobre en el sentido de la total dependencia de nuestro Dios como el Padre. Sólo aquellos que están en necesidad y reconocen que no son capaces de satisfacer esas necesidades son libres, sin miedo, capaces de regocijarse en el Dios de las sorpresas.

Recordemos que nada es imposible con nuestro Dios. El mismo Dios que fue fiel a su promesa a María es también el mismo Dios que nos invita a incluir a su Hijo en nuestra vida frágil y rota. Con ese mismo espíritu que eclipsó a María, podemos hacer que Cristo venga otra vez a nuestro mundo perturbado durante estos difíciles y aterradores días.

Lo que sucedió hace 2.000 años sucede otra vez este día. Como María, decimos nuestro sí. Que sea lo que Dios quiera. Es una cuestión de confianza y una medida de nuestra

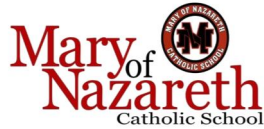

QUESTION: What does it mean to say that Christmas is a celebration of Christ's "incarnation"?

ANSWER: At Christmas, we celebrate the birth of Jesus. In doing so, we celebrate Christ's "incarnation." But what does this mean and why is it so important?

The word "incarnation" literally means "to become flesh" or "to be made flesh." In common usage, we usually think about something becoming incarnate in the sense of an abstract idea becoming a physical reality: "the artist's vision became incarnate in stone." When we speak of the incarnation of Jesus we are speaking of the fact that the invisible God, at a definite moment in time, broke into the human experience in the visible person of Jesus Christ – one person with a divine nature and a human nature. This is to say that God became flesh.

One could spend an entire lifetime reflecting on the meaning and importance of this event and still not come to a complete understanding. However, one thing that is worth recognizing is that the humanity of Jesus is true humanity. Jesus did not simply "put on a human suit" and pretend to be human. This means that he truly tasted the human experience – all things except sin. It means that he truly enjoyed the good things in life and we should as well. St. Irenaeus of Lyon famously said that the glory of God is a human being fully alive. It also means that he truly felt sorrow and sadness, especially when he encountered sadness and pain in his friends. It means that Christ truly knows our own personal joys and sorrows and wants to be personally present in our lives.

The heart of the meaning of the incarnation is this: there is no area of our lives that is without meaning – no area of our lives where God is not present. The challenge for each of us is to develop a sensitivity that allows us to become aware of his presence – through daily prayer, through weekly worship at Mass, and through acts of service. As we become aware of God's constant presence, we become aware of his incarnation – not only 2000 years ago but also today, personally.
