WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

All of us are patiently waiting for spring. It has been a long and cold winter. There is a new season coming, a new time, a promise of something better. Hope springs eternal in the human heart. It is a time to know and appreciate God's care, concern and love for each one of us. That is what the story about the woman at the well is all about. It is a beautiful story. It is about "change" and "conversion," a "turning away" from the old in order to embrace the new. It is about a fresh awareness of what God is all about in our daily lives.

Much can be learned from this story. First, it is Jesus Who begins this conversation at the well. It is always God Who breaks into our time, our daily lives with His invitation of love. It is not that we suddenly decide to change on our own. It is by invitation and we are called to respond to that invitation. Before the alcoholic, the game or drug addict can mend his ways, he must come to the realization that there is a greater power outside of himself and then he must let that power take charge of his life. All conversion - even the very desire to change - is a gift, freely given. It is a slow and gradual process, never sudden or overnight. It is the work of the Spirit and it is a work which lasts a lifetime. Saint or sinner, all of us are called to an ongoing conversion.

The woman at the well goes through this process before she recognized that Jesus is the Messiah. She wonders why this man even speaks to her - a woman and a Samaritan! Then she is curious about Him. What is He all about? Finally she freely listens to what He has to say, and with the help of the townspeople, she becomes aware that Jesus is the Savior.

This gradual awareness of Who Jesus is begins this process of conversion. To know the Lord is to accept His ways, and in knowing His ways, striving to become a disciple. In other words, changes in my day-to-day behavior are caused by my daily experience of the Lord.

The woman tells us even more about conversion. Change has more to do with the "future" than with the "past." Even God in all of His almighty power cannot change the past. It is the future that really matters. The woman knew she had sinned, but she also knows now she is forgiven, loved by God and challenged to a whole new way of life. Having experienced Jesus' healing grace, she goes off to tell others about what has happened to her. She wants to share that experience with the world. We would say that she has become an evangelizer by her change of attitude.

We are almost at the half way mark in our journey through Lent, our time of change and conversion. Our daily choices, our faithfulness and all of our dying to selfishness and sin remind us of the good work that God has begun in each of us. He will see that good work brought to its completion. The Lord will break into our ordinary routines and lives to surprise us when we least expect Him. He loves us, not only in spite of our past failures and sinfulness but because of our humanness, our weakness and our need for His love. All we need do is to sit by the well, be open to God's invitation to a new life and then become more aware of His love. The rest follows just as spring follows winter. We are to stand before the Person of the living God and let Him be God for us for that is exactly what He wants to be.

Todos nosotros esperamos pacientemente la primavera. Ha sido un invierno largo y frío. Llega una nueva temporada, un nuevo tiempo, una promesa de algo mejor. La esperanza es eterna en el corazón humano. Es un momento para conocer y apreciar el cuidado, la preocupación y el amor de Dios por cada uno de nosotros. De eso se trata la historia sobre la mujer del pozo. Es una hermosa historia. Se trata de "cambio" y "conversión", un "alejamiento" de lo viejo para abrazar lo nuevo. Se trata de una nueva conciencia de lo que Dios es en nuestra vida diaria.

Se puede aprender mucho de esta historia. Primero, es Jesús quien comienza esta conversación en el pozo. Siempre es Dios quien irrumpe en nuestro tiempo, nuestra vida diaria con su invitación de amor. No es que de repente decidamos cambiar por nuestra cuenta. Es por invitación y estamos llamados a responder a esa invitación. Antes de que el alcohólico, el juego o drogadicto pueda arreglar sus caminos, debe darse cuenta de que hay un poder mayor fuera de él y luego debe dejar que ese poder se haga cargo de su vida. Toda conversión - incluso el mismo deseo de cambiar - es un regalo, dado libremente. Es un proceso lento y gradual, nunca repentino ni durante la noche. Es el trabajo del Espíritu y es un trabajo que dura toda la vida. Santo o pecador, todos estamos llamados a una conversión continua.

La mujer en el pozo pasa por este proceso antes de reconocer que Jesús es el Mesías. Ella se pregunta por qué este hombre incluso le habla - una mujer y un samaritano! Entonces ella siente curiosidad por él. ¿De qué trata Él? Finalmente ella escucha libremente lo que Él tiene que decir y luego, con la ayuda de la gente del pueblo, se da cuenta de que Jesús es el Salvador.

Este conocimiento gradual de Quién es Jesús comienza este proceso de conversión. Conocer al Señor es aceptar Sus caminos, y conocer Sus caminos, para llegar a ser un discípulo. En otras palabras, los cambios en mi comportamiento diario son causados por mi experiencia diaria del Señor.

La mujer nos dice aún más sobre la conversión. El cambio tiene que ver más con el "futuro" que con el "pasado". Incluso Dios en todo su poder omnipotente no puede cambiar el pasado. Es el futuro lo que realmente importa. La mujer sabía que había pecado, pero ahora también sabe que está perdonada, amada por Dios y desafiada a una nueva forma de vida. Después de haber experimentado la gracia sanadora de Jesús, va a contarles a otros lo que le sucedió. Ella quiere compartir esa experiencia con el mundo. Diríamos que se ha convertido en evangelizadora por su cambio de actitud.

Estamos casi a mitad de camino en nuestro viaje a través de la Cuaresma, nuestro tiempo de cambio y conversión. Nuestras elecciones diarias, nuestra fidelidad y toda nuestra muerte al egoísmo y al pecado nos recuerdan el buen trabajo que Dios ha comenzado en cada uno de nosotros. Él verá que el buen trabajo se completó. El Señor irrumpirá en nuestras rutinas y vidas ordinarias para sorprendernos cuando menos lo esperemos. Él nos ama, no solo a pesar de nuestros fracasos y pecaminosos del pasado, sino a causa de nuestra humanidad, nuestra debilidad y nuestra necesidad de su amor. Todo lo que necesitamos hacer es sentarnos al lado del pozo, estar abiertos a la invitación de Dios a una nueva vida y luego tomar conciencia de su amor. El resto sigue al igual que la primavera sigue al invierno. Debemos enfrentar a la Persona del Dios viviente y dejar que Él sea Dios para nosotros, porque eso es exactamente lo que Él quiere que sea.

These special rites are celebrated with our Elect on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent, and will occur at the following Masses: 11:00am Mass (3/4), 9:00am (3/11), and 5:00pm (3/17). The Elect are those preparing for Baptism. In their journey to the font, they have already been received among us at the Rite of Acceptance and enrolled in the Book of the Elect in the Rite of Election. Even if we don't attend the liturgies where these rites are celebrated, it can be wonderful to reflect upon the journey the Elect are making during Lent, as an inspiration and source of renewal for us in our own journey. QUESTION: What is the best way to prepare for confession?

ANSWER: One of the familiar dimensions of our Lenten preparation is the threefold practice of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Additionally, the Church earnestly recommends taking advantage of the sacrament of Confession. One easily thinks of the words of the Psalmist: "A contrite, humbled heart, O God, you will not scorn." (Ps 51:19) It is our humility that brings us close to God. Here are a few tips on how to make a good confession this Lent:

Plan a time to go. It is often said that half the battle is just showing up. Decide when you are going to go to confession, put it on your calendar, and then "just show up."

Make a good examination of conscience. The heart of a good confession is self-awareness. Do an internet search for "catholic examination of conscience" and prayerfully read through one of the lists of questions. Do this several times throughout the week leading up to your confession, asking God to help you to see yourself clearly.

Stir up a feeling of contrition. A key part of confession is being sorry and having the intention of changing your life. Confession is intended, among other things, to help us to clearly see those areas of our life that stand in need of conversion and to invite in God's grace.

Be courageous in the sacrament. Some people get nervous about confession. But, the truth of the matter is that generally speaking, we are our own worse critics. There is a fear that the priest will think poorly of a person who confesses a lot of sins. However, the opposite is usually the case. Making a thorough and thoughtful confession is a sign of spiritual maturity.

HOW ARE POOR BOX DONATIONS USED?

Particularly during Lent, we try to embrace the practice of almsgiving. One way to do this is through our Poor Box.

All monies placed in the wooden Poor Boxes, located in the Church Foyer and in the Historic Chapel, go to our Poor Box fund. (EXCEPTION: The Poor Boxes are specially marked for Archdiocesan Special Collections about once a month.) Much of our Poor Box funds are channeled on a monthly basis through the Upper Montgomery County Assistance Network, Gaithersburg HELP and Germantown HELP. These funds also help support advocacy organizations such as Action in Montgomery. We often work closely with the City of Gaithersburg's Community Services Program Manager in contributing to collections supported by many organizations to assist especially needy persons in the local community. Emergency assistance for parishioners is sometimes given from our Poor Box.
