WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

We all are familiar with death. It is all around us, in us and part of our daily lives. We see it in nature when the seasons change, when daylight dies to darkness. Each of us experience small deaths as we grow older and change from day to day. We grieve and mourn our loved ones when they die. We would rather not think about our own death. We wonder if we will have the courage, faith, grace and heart to meet our God face to face. Paul has some comforting words for us: "None of us lives as our own master and none of us dies as our own master. While we live we are responsible to the Lord and when we die, we die as His servants. We belong to the Lord."

That is what the story of Lazarus is all about. We belong to the Lord. First of all the story again reminds us that there is life after death. It tells us that Jesus is Lord of all life. Secondly, in that conversation that Jesus had with Mary and Martha, we learn that resurrection is not so much a matter of our faithfulness to all the rules and regulations, but rather the Father's faithfulness to His word, to His promise of life everlasting as shown in the Resurrection of His Son. Jesus is the first born of the dead. And where He is, there we also will be. God, Our Father, has sent His son to tell us that life is so good, so beautiful, and so precious that not even death can overcome it. Jesus is our life and our resurrection. Whoever believes in Him will never die. Like Martha, the Lord asks each one of us: "Do you believe this?"

If you believe that and I believe that, then we must live it. So often we meet people who look like and act like death warmed over. They are like Lazarus in the tomb, all bound up and tied up in knots. Their lack of faith and trust in a loving God and Father is shown in the way they live out their daily lives. If we truly belong to the Lord, then Resurrection is not something reserved only for a life hereafter. It is also part of our everyday lives. It is part of all those little deaths we suffer, all of our sickness and pain, all the difficulty and hardship we experience and endure. It is exactly through that pain and suffering that we find new life. It is the paschal mystery lived over and over again; the suffering, death and resurrection of the Lord of life. As people of faith, we know the Lord is truly there to renew us, to encourage us and give us the strength to carry on and become His holy people.

Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, but He also made a request: "Untie him now and let him go free." By our example of faith we untie others and bring them freedom to become brothers and sisters in the Lord. There are many who live in the darkness of selfishness and sin, who long to see the brightness of a new day. There are others enslaved by past mistakes who need our compassion and forgiveness, our mercy and love. There are many who find life more like death and each day becomes unbearable. We can be there for them when we visit the sick, comfort the bereaved, and share our hope with the hopeless. Believe it or not, we have the power to untie the restraints binding the hopes and dreams of so many of our young people who see no future. The challenge we face each day is to bring vitality and life to our suffering and rather deadly serious world.

Todos estamos familiarizados con la muerte. Está a nuestro alrededor, en nosotros y es parte de nuestra vida cotidiana. Lo vemos en la naturaleza cuando cambian las estaciones, cuando la luz del día se apaga. Todos experimentamos pequeñas muertes a medida que envejecemos y cambiamos día a día. Lloramos a nuestros seres queridos cuando mueren. Preferiríamos no pensar en nuestra propia muerte. Nos preguntamos si tendremos el coraje, la fe, la gracia y el corazón para enfrentar a nuestro Dios cara a cara. San Pablo tiene palabras reconfortantes: "Ninguno de nosotros vive como nuestro propio amo y ninguno de nosotros muere como nuestro propio maestro. Mientras vivimos somos responsables ante el Señor y cuando morimos, morimos como Sus siervos. Nosotros somos propiedad del Señor."

De eso se trata la historia de Lázaro. Nosotros le pertenecemos al Señor antes que nada. La historia nuevamente nos recuerda que hay vida después de la muerte. Nos dice que Jesús es el Señor de toda la vida. En segundo lugar, en esa conversación que Jesús tuvo con María y Marta, aprendemos que la resurrección no es tanto una cuestión de nuestra fidelidad a todas las reglas, sino más bien de fidelidad del Padre a su palabra, a su promesa de vida eterna como se muestra en la Resurrección de Su Hijo. Jesús es el primer nacido de los muertos. Y donde Él está, allí también estaremos. Dios, nuestro Padre, ha enviado a su hijo para decirnos que la vida es tan buena, tan bella y tan preciosa que ni siquiera la muerte puede vencerla. Jesús es nuestra vida y nuestra resurrección. Quien crea en Él nunca morirá. Como Marta, el Señor nos pregunta a cada uno de nosotros: "¿Crees esto?"

Si creemos esto entonces debemos vivirlo. Muy a menudo nos encontramos con personas que actúan como Lázaro en la tumba, atados con mil nudos. Su falta de fe y confianza en un Dios y Padre amoroso se muestra en la forma en que viven su vida cotidiana. Si realmente pertenecemos al Señor, entonces la Resurrección no es algo reservado solo para una vida en el más allá. También es parte de nuestra vida cotidiana. Es parte de todas esas pequeñas muertes que sufrimos, todas nuestras enfermedades y dolores, todas las dificultades y soledades que experimentamos y soportamos. Es exactamente a través de ese dolor y sufrimiento que encontramos una nueva vida. Es el misterio pascual vivido una y otra vez; el sufrimiento, la muerte y la resurrección del Señor de la vida. Como personas de fe, sabemos que el Señor está verdaderamente allí para renovarnos, alentarnos y darnos la fuerza para continuar y llegar a ser su pueblo santo.

Jesús resucitó a Lázaro de entre los muertos, pero también hizo una petición: "Desátenlo ahora y déjenlo ir libre". Con nuestro ejemplo de fe, desatamos a los demás y les damos libertad para convertirnos en hermanos y hermanas en el Señor. Hay muchos que viven en la oscuridad del egoísmo y el pecado, que anhelan ver el brillo de un nuevo día. Hay otros esclavizados por errores pasados que necesitan nuestra compasión y perdón, nuestra misericordia y amor. Hay muchos que encuentran la vida más como la muerte y cada día se vuelve insostenible. Podemos estar allí para ellos cuando visitamos a los enfermos, confortamos a los deudos y compartimos nuestra esperanza con los desesperados. Créalo o no, tenemos el poder de desatar las restricciones que atan las esperanzas y los sueños de muchos de nuestros jóvenes que no ven futuro. El desafío que enfrentamos cada día es traer vitalidad y vida a nuestro sufrimiento y al mundo más bien mortalmente serio.

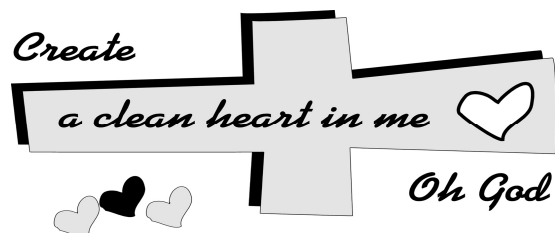

QUESTION: Why do we see words, such as "thou" and "thee" in our prayers?

ANSWER: Questions of language often fascinate people. The way that we speak is very personal because speech is how we communicate. Understandably, we are often fascinated by the words that make up the prayers that form the fabric of our spiritual life. There is an old adage: *Lex orandi, lex credendi* ("the law of praying is the law of believing"). By looking at how we pray, we can discover what we believe.

In some of our most common prayers, we find words that can, at first glance, sound archaic: Our Father who **art** in heaven, hallowed be **thy** name. Hail Mary full of grace, the Lord is with **thee**. Blessed **art thou** among women... *Thee, thy, thou* – why has the Church chosen to retain these words?

Languages change over time. (Just look at English, which is a mixture of grammar and vocabulary taken from early German, Norman French, Norse, Latin, and Greek.) Sometimes the changes are helpful, other times not. English is generally understood to be a language capable of expressing complex ideas succinctly. However, the more widely diffused a language becomes, the more it tends to simplify. One of the simplifications that can be seen in English is in our noun and verb endings. In many languages, there is a distinction made between the informal and the formal second person pronoun, i.e. the pronoun, "you." For example, Spanish use *tu* (informal) and *usted* (formal) to express the word "you." Similarly, French differentiates between *tu* (informal) and *vous* (formal).

In earlier usage, English also made this distinction. *Thou* was the informal form of *you*; *thy* was the informal form of *your*; and *thee* stood in for *you* when it was used as an object in a sentence. When we are referring to God's name or kingdom using the word *thy*, we are using a familiar form which reminds us of the intimacy that we have with God.
