WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

It does not matter how long one lives; it is really how well one lives each day. We all want to live the very best life possible, having good health, finding peace and happiness along the way, being fulfilled, loved and successful. All of us have one life to live and we hope and pray that it will be meaningful. Our Scripture on this Sunday give us some wise advice and insight into the successful life.

Jesus compared Himself and His followers to a grapevine. Within that vine there were two kinds of branches; those that bore fruit and those that were barren. The barren branches were cut away, gathered into piles and burned. The fruitful branches were pruned so that they would yield an even greater harvest.

As branches and part of that vine, you and I receive our life. Jesus is really saying that in some beautiful and mysterious way He lives in each of us and we are to find our daily life in Him. He alone is to be our strength, the source of all energy and power. The image of the vine and branches tell us that we are part of something much greater than self, that we belong to a very large family, the Church, the Body of Christ. It also says that you and I need others, that we depend upon their care, concern and especially their love. Apart from this vine there can be no life, no chance to find real happiness, no peace, nor any success. In fact, without the Lord, we are like withered, rejected, dry, old branches ready to be burned.

And there is more. There is no room for just sitting pretty on that vine, resting thinking all is well. We are to give glory to Our Father by bearing much fruit. We are to love in deed and in truth, and not merely talk about it. We are to love one another as He has commanded us to do. The barren branches on the vine were not evil. They did not bring forth bitter or sour grapes. They were just useless branches, yielding no grapes at all.

It was Mother Theresa of Calcutta who said that we should do something beautiful for our God each and every day. It isn't that God needs that beauty; we need to be signs of that beauty by the proper use of all the special gifts and talents that we have been given to build up God's kingdom. The things we do need not be grand or spectacular or beyond our abilities. The Lord will accept the smallest gift from a loving heart and turn it into the greatest and grandest successful life ever.

If Jesus is the vine and we are the branches, then we are intimately united to Him. Intimate is a wonderful word. It comes from the Latin which means to make myself known to another. We can only do this in prayer. Take time during this week to be intimate with the Lord and know that He will be intimate with you.

Jesús se comparó a sí mismo y a sus seguidores a una vid. Dentro de esa vid había dos clases de ramas; los que dieron fruto y los que fueron estériles. Las ramas estériles fueron cortadas, reunidas en pilas y quemadas. Las ramas fructíferas fueron podadas para que produjeran incluso una cosecha mayor.

Como ramas y parte de esa vid, tú y yo recibimos nuestra vida. Jesús realmente está diciendo que de alguna manera hermosa y misteriosa Él vive en cada uno de nosotros y debemos encontrar nuestra vida diaria en él. Solo él debe ser nuestra fuerza, la fuente de toda energía y poder. La imagen de la vid y las ramas nos dice que somos parte de algo mucho más grande que nosotros mismos, que pertenecemos a una gran familia, la Iglesia, el Cuerpo de Cristo. También dice que usted y yo necesitamos que dependamos de su cuidado, preocupación y especialmente de su amor. Aparte de esta vid, no puede haber vida, ni oportunidad de encontrar la verdadera felicidad, ni paz, ni ningún éxito. De hecho, sin el Señor, somos como viejas ramas marchitas y desechadas, listas para ser quemadas.

Y hay más. No hay lugar para simplemente sentarse bien en esa enredadera, descansando pensando que todo está bien. Debemos dar gloria a Nuestro Padre dando mucho fruto. Debemos amar de hecho y en verdad, y no solo hablar de ello. Debemos amarnos unos a otros como Él nos ha ordenado que hagamos. Las ramas estériles de la vid no eran malas. No produjeron uvas amargas o agrias. Eran solo ramas inútiles, sin producir uvas.

Fue la Madre Teresa de Calcuta quien dijo que debemos hacer algo hermoso para nuestro Dios todos los días. No es que Dios necesita esa belleza; necesitamos ser signos de esa belleza mediante el uso apropiado de todos los dones y talentos especiales que se nos han dado para edificar el reino de Dios. El Señor aceptará el regalo más pequeño de un corazón amoroso y lo convertirá en la más grande y exitosa vida de la historia.

Solo podemos hacer esto en oración. Tómese un tiempo durante esta semana para intimar con el Señor y saber que Él tendrá intimidad con usted.

QUESTION: What are some different types of prayer?

ANSWER: Over the past couple of weeks, we have been looking at the question of how to pray. Hopefully, it has become obvious that there is more than one type of prayer. Here are a few different types of prayer:

- ◆ *Prayer of Petition or Thanksgiving:* Here one sits and speaks to God about things that he or she needs or gives thanks to God for things that have been received.
- ◆ *Conversational Prayer:* This is a spontaneous free-form style of prayer in which one speaks to God as one would speak to a friend. There may also be periods of silence where a person simply enjoys the presence of God.
- ◆ *Lectio Divina:* This is the style of prayer that has been discussed over the past couple weeks in which a person uses the scriptures or another piece of spiritual reading as the anchor for prayer.
- ◆ *Memorized Vocal Prayer:* These are the prayers that we learn as a child, e.g. the Our Father and the Hail Mary. The goal is to not simply say them, but to attempt to conform our hearts to the words that are on our lips.
- ◆ *Formal Liturgical Prayer:* The most obvious example of this prayer is the Mass, which is one of the deepest forms of prayer that one can experience. There is also the Liturgy of the Hours; learn more by listening to the podcast below.

FORUM WITH COUNTY EXECUTIVE CANDIDATES

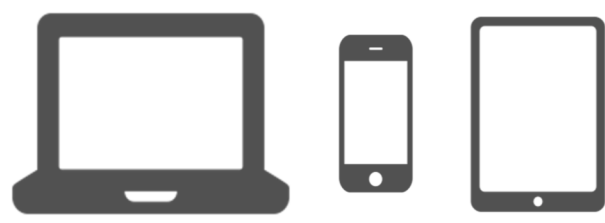
