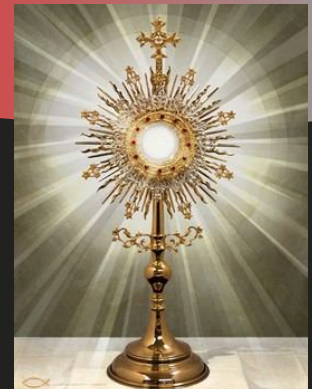

WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

We live in an age of locked doors, to make our lives secure, to be sure our homes are safe. We lock our cars. We even lock our Churches. We truly live in fear. All those locks and alarms are meant to free us from fear and worry, but they fail to do their job. Instead, they cause us to isolate ourselves from the world and from one another.

The Apostles locked the Upper Room because they were afraid of what would happen next. Even though they tried keep everybody out, Jesus was able to enter and stand before them. "Peace be with you", He said. In other words, don't be anxious; don't be afraid. It is really Me! "As the Father has sent Me, so I send you. Receive the Holy Spirit." Then something wonderful happened! They were changed, transformed from fearful followers to fearless people fired up to do the Father's will. They became enthusiastic, inspired by the Spirit to live the good news. The Lord has given them His peace and the power to forgive. They changed their fearful ways and their lives will never be the same again.

The gift of the Spirit is the power to forgive and forget. It is the gift of freedom, a wind blowing us toward a new creation, a new unity of purpose. The Spirit helps us to heal all separation and division and gives us a new hope for peace in our hearts, in our homes, in our neighborhoods, in our relationships and in our world.

The Lord Jesus comes to us with His peace, invading all of the upper rooms in which we try to lock ourselves away from others. He would have us turn our enemies, real or imagined, into allies and friends. Jesus comes to show us His wounds, His hands and side. They are not signs of defeat, but of victory and triumph over all evil, sin and even death. He comes to give us His peace, a peace that no one can give.

Finally, we hear in the Gospel the words of challenge. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Our task is to bring His peace to our troubled world. That is exactly why we need the Holy Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit who will guide and direct us in the ways of the kingdom.

All of us have received the power to forgive. It is not only the ordained that can loosen or bind. Each of us is called to forgiveness, just as the Lord has forgiven us. We say this every day in the Lord's prayer. How can we expect forgiveness when we are unwilling to extend that same forgiveness to others? We begin first of all in our families, where so often some members have not spoken to each other for the longest time. The next area of forgiveness is in our neighborhoods, in our schools and at our place of work. If we choose not to forgive, we continue to lock ourselves up in our anger, suffering, resentment, alienation and lack of peace. We are all in the need of forgiveness. We all make mistakes and often miss the mark. We are all cut out of the same cloth.

It is the Holy Spirit who will make us one because we were all baptized into one body, even though each of us has different kinds of spiritual gifts. That is why we need the Holy Spirit to unite us in all of our efforts to build the kingdom. Come Holy Spirit; fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle within us the fire of Your love.

En cambio, nos hacen aislarnos del mundo y de los demás.

Los apóstoles cerraron el Cenáculo porque tenían miedo de lo que sucedería a continuación. A pesar de que trataron de mantener a todos afuera, Jesús pudo entrar y pararse frente a ellos. "La paz sea contigo", dijo. En otras palabras, no te angusties; no tengas miedo ¡Soy realmente yo! "Como el Padre me ha enviado, así que te envío. Recibe el Espíritu Santo. ¡Entonces sucedió algo maravilloso! Fueron transformados, transformados de seguidores temerosos en personas valientes que se encendieron para cumplir la voluntad del Padre. Se volvieron entusiastas, inspirados por el Espíritu para vivir las buenas nuevas. El Señor les ha dado su paz y el poder de perdonar. Cambiaron sus formas temerosas y sus vidas nunca volverán a ser lo mismo.

Todos cometemos errores y a menudo perdemos la marca. Todos estamos cortados del mismo paño.

Es el Espíritu Santo quien nos hará uno porque todos fuimos bautizados en un solo cuerpo, aunque cada uno de nosotros tenga diferentes tipos de dones espirituales. Es por eso que necesitamos que el Espíritu Santo nos una en todos nuestros esfuerzos para construir el reino. Ven, espíritu santo; llena los corazones de tus fieles y enciende en nosotros el fuego de tu amor.

QUESTION: How should we understand the Genesis story about Adam and Eve?

ANSWER: Recently I found myself downtown at a "Theology on Tap" hosted by the Archdiocese of Washington featuring a question and answer session with Cardinal Wuerl. A young man presented him with the question of Adam and Eve and how one ought to interpret the stories found in the Bible, especially those found in the book of Genesis. It is an important question and one that presents itself to us in many different ways. With the profound insights offered by the modern empirical sciences, it can be difficult to know how to approach the Bible. The Cardinal began his answer by pointing out that Bible frequently makes use of images and symbols that hint at deeper truths, even when the images and symbols may not be literal descriptions of particular historical events. He was pointing out what the Second Vatican Council thought in *Dei Verbum* (13), that the Bible is "the words of God, expressed in human language."

This truth points to the answer of another question that is frequently encountered: "Do you take the Bible literally?" The question, of course, belies a certain misunderstanding of the Bible; for, as Bishop Robert Barron likes to quip: "It is the equivalent of asking if one takes the library literally." The Bible is not a book, but a library of collected books, each with its own style and pattern of speech. Some books are summary historical accounts, while others take the form of poetry, and others still take the form of epic saga.

The Book of Genesis and the story of the Fall of Adam and Eve communicates certain truths to us, even if the portrayal of historical events may not be communicated literally. It reveals to us that we were made for community and for friendship with God. It also reveals that that friendship was wounded - a wound that we still carry with us - a wound called "original sin." The exact nature of that wound, we will need to await next week to contemplate.
